## Music by Conjunto Aztlan

During the Texas State Conference awards luncheon on Saturday, October 28<sup>th</sup>, you will be entertained by the original music of Conjunto Aztlan. The group's name represents a spiritual and musical journey expressed through song and poetry. The word "conjunto" means a special kind of Tejano ensemble that has the button accordion and the 12 string bajo sexton as its main instruments. Aztlan as translated from the Aztec means a place of whiteness or the true homeland. In adopting the spiritual and cultural connection to the beliefs of the ancient Aztecs, the ensemble represents the self-determination and the affirmation of a movement meant to celebrate, defend and expand the musical and spiritual legacy of the Chicano people. Their songs feature politically, culturally and socially conscious lyrics in English and Spanish.

Members of the ensemble include: Clemencia Zapata, an Austin resident bringing together music, cultural arts and activism expressed in her powerful voice; Juan Tejeda, music instructor at Palo Alto College, is also a musician, songwriter and poet living in San Antonio; Jose Flores Peregrino, is a poet, musician, author and professor of English at Austin Community College in Austin; and Erik Flores is a musician, artist and founder of the popular Austin band, Sunvocina.
